◆Educational Philosophy of the Graduate School of Global Food Resources

The Graduate School of Global Food Resources aims to produce experts with knowledge of a wide range of fields, including agriculture, fisheries science, engineering, global environmental science, health science, economics, education, and political sciences, as well as experts in veterinary medicine, law, and life sciences.

♦Admission Policy

Under the four basic principles (Frontier Spirit, Global Perspectives, All-around Education, Practical Learning), the Graduate School of Global Food Resources needs students who:

- Acquire both broad perspectives on a global scale and deep understanding of local regions.
- Are aware of the importance of food, water, and land resources necessary for the 21st century strategy for survival.
- •Possess a noble spirit allowing them to throw away their selfishness and contribute to human society. We also encourage students who
- 1. Desire to comprehend and solve problems from both humanitarian and scientific perspectives.
- 2. Wish to receive hands-on practical education in both national and international settings.
- 3. Eagerly search for, discover, solve, recommend and examine problems on their own.
- 4. Possess a pioneering spirit and desire to succeed in global society.
- 5. Possess the determination to develop communication skills, teamwork skills, and the ability to take action.
- 6. Seek diverse and practical job opportunities not limited to research academia.

2. Screening Method

The scores of an essay-type test, an oral test and a TOEFL or TOEIC certificate are considered together to determine successful applicants.

3. Application Qualifications

- (1) Individuals who have graduated or expect to graduate from a university in March 2017.
- (2) Individuals who have been awarded or expect to be awarded a degree pursuant to Article 104, Clause 4, of the School Education Act.
- (3) Individuals who have completed 16 years of school education in a foreign country
- (4) Individuals who have completed 16 years of education in correspondence course subjects provided by foreign educational systems in Japan.
- (5) Individuals who have completed their education at educational institutions in Japan recognized as the equivalent of a university by foreign countries (limited to individuals who have completed 16 years of education in a foreign country) and designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science, and Technology.
- (6) Individuals who have received a degree equivalent to a bachelor's degree from a university or a school in a

foreign country (either which has been evaluated by a authority certified by the government of the country concerned or an authority concerned in regard to the overall performance of its education and research activities, or which has been separately designated by the Minister of Education, Sports, Science and Technology as an educational establishment equivalent to the above) upon completion of a program or a course of study requiring 3 or more years (including completion of a correspondence course of a foreign institute taken in Japan, and completion of a course of study designated as per (4) at a foreign educational establishment within the public education system of the country concerned).

- (7) Individuals who have completed a specialized course at a specialized training college on or after the date determined by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology. (The course is required to be designated by the Minister, and the course term needs to be four years or more. [Also, the course must meet other standards established by the Minister.])
- (8) Individuals designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology. (1953 Notice No. 5, Ministry of Education, Science and Culture)
- (9) Individuals who have attended a university for three or more years or individuals who apply to one of the following:
 - Those who have completed 15 years of school education in foreign countries.
 - Those who have completed 15 years of education in correspondence course subjects provided by foreign educational systems in Japan.
 - Those who have completed a foreign university's coursework at an educational institution in Japan that is positioned within the school education system of that foreign country as an educational body with a university course. (The completion of the coursework must be considered equivalent to the completion of 15 years of school education in that foreign country. In addition, the educational institution is required to be designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology.)
 - Furthermore, all individuals who meet this qualification must be deemed by this graduate school to have achieved excellent grades in the prescribed subjects.
- (10) Individuals who are recognized by the graduate school as possessing equivalent or greater academic skills in comparison to those of a university graduate based on an individual admission qualification screening and who will be 22 years of age as of March 31, 2017*
 - *This qualification applies to those who do not possess the qualifications of a university graduate, such as graduates of a national college of technology, junior college, specialized training college, or other types of schools, as well as graduates of Japanese branch schools of foreign universities or foreign schools.
 - (Note) Individuals applying based on the above qualifications (9) and (10) are required to undergo a preliminary review of application qualifications, so be sure to submit the following documents between November 28 (Mon.) and December 2 (Fri.), 2016.
 - ⇒ In the case of (9) ... Application for entrance qualification review, academic transcript, statement of purpose
 - ⇒ In the case of (10) ... Application for entrance qualification review, research history certificate, academic transcript, statement of purpose
 - There are designated forms for the application for entrance qualification review, research history certificate and statement of purpose. The forms must be requested from the graduate school.

5. Application Period

(1) Application period: December 19 (Mon.), 2016 to December 26 (Mon.), 2016 Applications shall be accepted from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (On weekday)

Applicants are required to bring both their electronic Power Point data and PDF data stored on USB stick. Applicants are also required to bring 4 copies of color printed hand out in A4 format (2 slides in 1 sheet)

*Applicants are required to come to the waiting room by 9 a.m. on February 5 (Sun.), when oral test is held. The location of the waiting room will be shown on the board at the front entrance hall of the Graduate School of Agriculture on the examination day.

7. Announcement of Successful Applicants

Results will be posted in the front entrance hall of the Graduate School of Agriculture at 16:00 (subject to change) on February 21 (Tue.), 2017, and mailed to applicants individually at the same time. Information about whether an applicant has passed or failed the exam will not be provided over the phone.

8. Enrollment and Tuition Fees

(1) Enrollment fee: 282,000 yen

(2) First-semester tuition fee: 267,900 yen (annual total: 535,800 yen)

Note: The above amounts are estimates. If these figures are revised at the time of admission or during enrollment, the new amount will apply as of the time of revision.

9. Completing the Application Form

Write all of your personal achievements and details since graduating from high school in the "Academic Background and Work History" section of the application form. If a false statement or omission is found after admission, that applicant's enrollment may be rescinded.

10. Privacy Policy

Names, addresses, and other personal information on application materials will be used solely for enrollee
selection, the announcement of exam results, and admission procedures. The personal information of those who
are accepted for admission shall also be used for administrative purposes after enrollment (student registration,
academic counseling, etc.), student support services (health management, scholarship applications, etc.), and

administrative tasks related to tuition, etc.

- Only the names and addresses of applicants may be used to facilitate communications from the Hokkaido
 University Frontier Foundation and the Hokkaido University Athletic Union, both of which are organizations

Long-Term Study System

1. Purpose of the Long-Term Study System

The long-term study system is available to students who would not be able to complete the program within the standard course term (two years for a master's course) due to full-time employment or other circumstances (including responsibilities related to the care of elderly or disabled family members or the raising of children) and therefore want a longer period of time to conduct their studies systematically. Students must file an application and may be approved for a systematically planned course of study (hereinafter referred to as "long-term study") after an individual review.

2. Eligibility for the Long-Term Study System

Individuals applying for the long-term study system must qualify as one of those listed below, be unable to make a commitment to full-time studies as a consequence of the circumstances described, and would therefore like to extend in advance the number of years over which they will conduct their studies (research).

- (1) Individuals who are engaged in full-time employment, such as those currently employed by government agencies or companies (excluding those who will continue to receive salaries while being relieved of their work duties), and self-employed individuals
- (2) Individuals who are engaged in temporary or part-time employment that adversely affects their studies
- (3) Individuals whose responsibilities, such as raising children or caring for other family members, adversely affect their studies to the same degree as the responsibilities listed in item (2) above

3. Long-Term Study Period

The allowable length of period under the long-term study system is up to four years for a master's course. Study periods for long-term study applicants are approved in one-year increments.

The maximum length of enrollment for a student who has been approved for long-term study is up to an additional two years beyond the approved long-term study period in the master's course.

The period of time off that the Graduate School of Global Food Resources will allow is the same for students under either the standard term of study or long-term study program, i.e., two years for master's students.

4. Application Procedures for the Long-Term Study System

(1) Application deadline

Those wishing to apply for the long-term study system should apply at the time they submit their admission applications. Application forms for the long-term study system are available at the Students Affairs Section, Graduate School of Agriculture

(2) Submission of documents

Submit the following documents to the Students Affairs Section, Agricultural Studies Administration Office:

- 1) Application for long-term study (form 1)
- 2) Long-term study plan (form 2)
- 3) Materials verifying your reasons for needing long-term study approval
- (3) Notification of review results

The Chair of the Preparatory Committee for the Graduate School of Global Food Resources will notify applicants of the results of their reviews.

5. Contraction or Extension of the Long-Term Study Period

If deemed necessary by the Graduate School of Global Food Resources, approval may be granted for a contraction or extension of the long-term study period once, and only once, during the student's period of enrollment.

For more information, contact the Students Affairs Section, Graduate School of Agriculture.

6. Tuition Fee Adaptations

The tuition fees of students who have been approved for the long-term study system shall be calculated in annual amounts by dividing the total tuition fee for the standard term of study (master's course: annual tuition fee \times 2 years) by the number of years for which the long-term study has been approved. In cases where the tuition fee amount is revised or a change to the long-term study period is approved, the tuition fee will be recalculated at that time. However, any tuition fees already paid will not be adjusted retroactively.

Be sure not to pay the tuition fee for your current term of study until you are notified of whether your application for the long-term study system or a change thereof has been approved.
